**MEETING MINUTES**  
**PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING**  
**APRIL 15, 2019**  
**GERMANTOWN VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM**

CALL: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Hughes.

ROLL CALL: Chairman Hughes, Trustee Myers, Trustee Warren and Trustee Wing were present.

Also present were Police Chief Hoell, Police Captain Snow, Fire Chief Delain, Clerk Braunschweig.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No discussion.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: a motion was made by Warren, seconded by Myers, to approve the minutes of the March 4, 2019 Public Safety Committee meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Hoell reported on the following:

- This is National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week
- Leadership Germantown held a fundraiser for the K9 Unit with a birthday celebration for Hatto, they were assisted by residents at the Gables who donated baked goods and by the K9 Committee
- Last week the department received a donation for \$15,000 for the K9 Unit from a private party to honor the wishes of their son who had passed away
- Additional fundraisers will be held by Leadership for the K9 Unit at Robert's Custard on April 23<sup>rd</sup> and at Café Zupas in Menomonee Falls in June
- Discussed current investigations involving overdose deaths, accident caused by overdose

FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Delain reported on the following:

- Vehicle which sustained damage due to freezing temps had final repairs done
- Malfunction in brake system was also repaired
- New construction in Village is keeping them busy with testing, inspections, etc.
- Continue making progress with paramedic program
- Warren questioned the spike in inspections for December 2018, Delain explained that this happens at the end of the year when there is a push to complete the inspections. He said that June and December will show an increase in those numbers.
- Explained the procedure for tracking the arrival of the first fire or EMS unit

OVERTIME REPORTS:

Police Department – Hoell advised overtime is tracking normally, one officer on light duty with an on-duty injury

Fire Department – Delain advised overtime numbers are tracking normally, they also have one officer on light duty which they are filling with POC or full-time personnel

Hoell and Delain advised there were no objections from the police and fire departments. Motion carried unanimously.

OPERATOR LICENSE: Roger Olson III [Recommended Denial]: a motion was made by Myers, to accept the denial of this application for Operator License. Motion failed for lack of a second.

A motion was made by Wing, seconded by Myers, to forward the application for Operator License on Roger Olson III to Village Board with a recommendation of approval. Discussion followed with Snow advising that the police department recommended denial on the application due to a felony possession conviction from June 2018.

Roger Olson III, who resides in Sussex, was present and spoke to the committee regarding the felony charge and advised he was asking for a second chance to work a full-time job at the Quick Pick Travel Plaza, N128 W21760 Holy Hill Road. He stated the arrest occurred when he was 17 and he has done community service hours. Owner of the Quick Pick Travel Plaza, Asif Vadsaria of Germantown, was present and spoke to the committee on behalf of the applicant. He advised Mr. Olson had been working for him for a couple of months and had been honest about his history. He added that Mr. Olson was a good employee with good work ethics, was respectful and he had no cause to think he would be a problem. Wing asked if the facility had cameras inside, Mr. Vadsaria stated there is inside surveillance which would be fully operational by the following week.

Motion to approve carried 3-1 with Myers, Warren and Wing voting aye; Hughes voted nay.

SUBJECT: SECOND K9 UNIT FOR GERMANTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Germantown Police Department would like to purchase and assign a second K9 Unit that would be scheduled on third shift. With the continued efforts of the Germantown Police Citizen K9 Unit Fundraising Committee and the great community support of over 14 years, the K9 account has the funds to purchase a second K9, equipment and K9 vehicle assigned to the second handler. This would be 100% purchased via donations.

Over the years, we have found the use of a K9 to be very efficient in police work and a great officer safety tool. I can cite an example of a case from several months ago. GPD Officers pursued a reckless driver that eventually crashed and became stuck in a farm field. The driver and passenger ran off into a wooded area. Officers could not locate them due to darkness and the wooded area. Without a K9, a number of officers would have had to respond and set up a perimeter. If night vision didn't work, officers would have to wait for a drone, if available, to arrive from West Bend. If that didn't work, officers would have to wait until daylight to start a search. Instead, the GPD K9 immediately found a track and both suspects were quickly located and taken into custody without incident and minimal number of officers needed.

We had another chase in the middle of the night on January 4, 2019, where Hatto was deployed. While we were in pursuit, the Washington County Sheriff's Dept. used tire deflation devices to stop the vehicle. One of the occupants hid in a wooded area. Hatto was deployed and quickly located the suspect.

Some additional bullet points as to why a second K9 unit would be a great value:

- More K9 availability on the road, both third and second shifts would have coverage.
- Conduct interdepartmental K9 training, experienced handlers capable of being good decoys for the other's dog.
- Not every track/area search is a single dog job. Dogs burn out dependent on weather conditions and length of operation.
- Officer safety, most aggravated suspects comply when a K9 is introduced into the incident.
- The K9 has become very popular with the public and we receive many requests to appear at area events. A second K9 would help us accommodate those requests and help GPD have positive experiences with the public.
- Interdiction events more efficient.
- Departmental prestige (drawing more candidates for hiring)
- We can make more frequent, smaller scale, school searches possible.

It is not uncommon for departments to have more than one K9 unit on staff. The following Departments have more than one:

The following is a breakdown of costs associated with a new dog. Due to the generosity of the Germantown community, our K9 account balance is in excess of \$122,000. We are very comfortable with this balance to sustain a second K9 unit. If approved, it will take approximately one year to have a second K9 unit operational.

\*Because it is a new squad addition and not a replacement, all new equipment would need to be purchased. An example of some of the larger items needed are a laptop computer, radar, squad camera, radio, K9 cage, lighting, rifle, defibrillator, safety equipment (vest, helmet, bailout bag)

If approved, we would be placed on a waiting list with the kennel of our choosing. The second K9 would probably be operational by late summer to early fall in 2019.
